Mayors Report V.

a. Proclamation in Honor of Direct Support Professionals

City Clerk Report

Alex Seibert filling in for City Clerk Danette Henderson provided a report to the council for review that included a copy of the bank statement.

City Attorney VII.

City Attorney not presented to provide report.

Authorized Guest Speakers VIII.

a. Chamber of Commerce Tonya Pryor

Pryor presented to the council a map showing the layout of the Fall Festival asking for permission for street closures of Court Street (Main to Vine), Vine Street (Court to Catherine), and Catherine Street (Main to Vine), and barricades for the street closures.

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Motion made by Alderman Smith, seconded by Alderman Simpson to authorize street closures of Court Street (Main to Vine), Vine Street (Court to Catherine), and Catherine Street (Main to Vine), and barricades for the street closures. Motion passed unanimously.

Council Committee Reports IX.

a. Planning and Zoning - No report at this time.

b. Parks and Cemetery

Mayor Miller informed the council that the City had received a package with the available options of how the North Park Project will look and informed the council that City Staff will contact Steve Yates with the Parks & Cemetery committee to go over the information.

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c. Economic Development

Alderman Schneider informed the council that there will be a meeting going over the information needed for the Economic Development sales tax and invited all of the council members to attend.

X. **Department Reports**

a. Police - Chief James informed the council that the police department is down to two vehicles due to maintenance issues and they should be up to full fleet soon. Chief James also informed the council with the winter months soon approaching the nuisances will be more focused on derelict vehicles and yard waste in preparation for bad weather.

b. Water - Hausdorf informed the council there is a leak over by Missouri Metalcraft due to old age and needs repaired and requested the council permission to purchase the materials

needed to make the repairs.

Motion made by Alderman Smith, seconded by Alderman Saunders to authorize Hausdorf to purchase materials up to \$3,000.00 to repair the water leak by Missouri Metaleraft Motion passed unanimously.

> Hausdorf also informed the council that there was an algae bloom on the lake causing the noticeable taste and smell of the water and that it has been handled. Hausdorf also informed the council that there has been more algae on West Lake by Mosswood and that he has been exploring options to try and improve the lake. A debate was held and Hausdorf informed the council he would reach out to the Missouri Department of Conservation and see what other options the city can explore.

Electric - Mayor Miller informed the council that the original quote for the substation batteries was cancelled due to misinformation on the lead times of the batteries. Miller informed the council that he has contact MPUA for assistance in the issue and that they were able to assist Mayor Miller with locating batteries for the substation and has presented a quote from Electrorep for 10 120 Volt batteries, rack, and charger for the substation.

Motion was made by Alderman Smith, seconded by Alderman Saunders to cancel the Power Solutions quote and to accept the quote from Electrorep for 10 120-volt batteries, rack, and charger for the substation. Motion passed with all in favor.

d. Gas

i. F-350 Repairs - Osborn with the gas department informed the council that he is in the process of getting the quotes but is waiting for them. The F-350 repair quotes are tabled for the next meeting. Osborn also requested the council for permission to allow him to seek applications for a gas technician.

Motion was made by Alderman Simpson, seconded by Alderman Smith to allow Osborn to seek applications for a gas technician. Motion passed unanimously.

e. Street - Written report provided.

f. Airport - Mayor Miller informed the council that he would be meeting with Del Buckman to go over the RFQ for engineering.

g. Mosswood - Nothing to report.

Presentation of Bills and Approval of Payments XI.

A motion was made by Alderman Simpson, seconded by Alderman Smith approving the accounts payable presented for October 3, 2024, and considered warrants approved by the Mayor since the last council meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

New Business

Motion was made by Alderman Simpson, seconded by Alderman Schneider to recognize Kathy and Bill Troy to Address the council. Motion passed unanimously.

Kathy Troy expressed her frustrations with the building permit and building process that the Troy family had experience in the construction of BK's Place. A debate was held and Mayor Miller requested Kerry Lee to meet with Kathy and Bill Troy to discuss what needs to be done to get their business started.
